Alliteration and Assonance

Literature Writing Assignment

- One of the literary devices popular in the many forms of poetry is <u>alliteration</u>.
- ▶ Alliteration the repetition of the same sound or letter at the beginning of each or most of the words in a sentence.

The easiest way to use <u>alliteration</u> would be to repeat the starting letter of the words.



- Another literary device popular in the many forms of poetry is <u>assonance</u>.
- ▶ **Assonance** the repetition of the vowel sounds in stressed syllables containing dissimilar consonant sounds.



Example

This tale is true, and mine. It tells /

▶ How the sea took me, swept me back

And forth in sorrow and fear and pain,

Showed me suffering in a hundred ships,
