1) Traditional Research Paper

- a. Organize and synthesize researched information from all 8 thinking maps in a (minimum of) 8 to 10 page research paper, not including Cover Page, Bibliography or Work Cited page.
- Typed Double Spaced, Times New Roman Font, MLA Format, Bibliography of Resources or Works Cited page.
- c. Include 8 thinking maps in the submission of this final product.
- 2) Informative Portfolio 8 Thinking Maps = 8 Informative Essays
 - a. Transform information from each thinking map to individual informative essays.
 - b. Each essay must be informative; essays must be clear and thorough while it explains the topic.
 - c. Requirements: Cover Page, Typed Double Spaced, Times New Roman Font, MLA Format, Bibliography of Resources or Works Cited page.
 - d. Include 8 thinking maps in the submission of this final product.

Level 4 – Presentation: Create an informative power point or slide presentation about your topic. You must complete Level 2 and 3 project requirements.

- a. Minimum of 10 15 slides consisting of informative and specific details from the research.
- b. Include relative visual/illustrated examples to accompany written details.
- c. Information must be equally given using bulleted information and visuals.
- d. Title Slide must contain the Career Name, Student Name, Period #, Subject, Due Date.
- e. MLA Format must be used for Bibliography or Works Cited. This information must be provided as the last slide.
- f. Students must complete Level 2 and Level 3 project requirements.
