Different Kinds of Security Forces

Missile Protection

- Missile protection specialist job is to protect powerful weapons, guard facilities, and must always be fully prepared at all times.



Law Enforcement

- To have a high level security, on every U.S Air force base has their own police force.
- They specialize in law enforcement, combat arms, and protect their fellow Airmen.
- They have similar responsibilities as a civilian officer, including investigating crimes on base, responding to emergencies, and patrol on base.



Working With Military Dogs

- A military working dog handler (MDW) is in charge with protecting and defending the base alongside with their loyal canine partner.
- With determination, respect, and strong passion for dogs, a Dog Handler personally trains their dogs in law enforcement, including detecting drugs and explosives. Together they are immensely skilled team ready for anything.



Security Forces Officer

- A Security Officer is the leader of a squad or battalion and have leadership skills.
- A kind of leader that is equipped with physical and mental ability to manage the security on the base.
- Expert in weapon system, combat arms, air base defense, law enforcement, and anti-terrorism.
